In Cleveland her work has been seen at Karamu, Cleveland Play House, Dancing Wheels, Oberlin and Cleveland Contemporary Dance Theatre. Numerous awards include the numerous grants and commissions, the Cleveland Arts Prize, 3 Bessies (NY Dance and Performance), 2008 American Dance Festival Distinguish Award for Teaching and 2007 John S.
